## Uniform Update

Please do not buy, replace or source a P.E kit this year. Why? As we will provide you with a brand new kit free of charge! Governors confirmed last week that we can order a kit for each child across both of our schools in readiness for September. Large donations to the schools were given following our engagement in a project in 2019. The project led by the Engagement Endowment Foundation was created to support families in areas such as ours. In light of our change to our PE uniform governors agreed to fund a new PE top, set of shorts and an outdoor jacket for each pupil. They have provided samples of sizes at school (go to the office and ask for Mrs Smith/Mrs Lund/Miss Truelove) that you must use to try on for size and quality, then order on the website. Uniform can be delivered to school free of charge, before the summer break (or on the first day/in the autumn term if needed). You can pay for delivery to your own home. This is the first time we are using an online service and this is why they have provided samples directly to school to ensure it is a smooth service.
