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Fluoridated Milk

For some time Blackpool have been encouraging families to engage in a fluoridated milk scheme. If your child is in reception class they will be bringing home a fluoridated milk information leaflets/opt out form. The local health authority believes that this evidence-based scheme is having a real impact. However, whilst it is good news that the percentage of 5 year-old children in Blackpool with visually obvious dental decay is falling, nearly a third (31.2%) still have decay. This shows the continued need for our children to have access to fluoride on a daily basis. Unless the opt out form is returned then your child will receive fluoridated milk when they go into Year 1 in September Please see the leaflet for more information.

Free Breakfast Scheme

The team at Blackpool Council have asked that we share this notice with you:

As part of the ongoing monitoring of the Blackpool Council's Free School Breakfast Programme in Blackpool, once a term we will be asking pupils attending this school some simple questions regarding what they had for breakfast on a certain date. We will also be using data we hold on children within the school as part of this study. All information will be aggregated, and no one child, or their answers, will be identifiable within the analysis. If, for any reason, you wish for your child not to take part in the monitoring, can you please let us know, and we will ensure that they are not included.
